PRESENTATION RECOGNIZING OUTGOING COMMITTEE MEMBER

Melissa Margain accepted the award for outgoing Committee Member Mary N. Piepho.

RECEIVE PRESENTATION ON 511 CONTRA COSTA PROGRAM UPDATE (PRESENTATION: PETER ENGEL, CONTRA COSTA TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY AND STANTEC)

Peter Engel, the Director of Programs for the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA), explained that TRANSPAC and TRANSPLAN had teamed together to provide the Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Program through 511 Contra Costa for Central and East County. Since TRANSPAC no longer wanted to administer the program, the CCTA had been asked to take over the program, which had been done, and the day-to-day operations were being provided by the CCTA's Project Management Consultant Stantec. Stantec had hired the staff from the prior program.

Mr. Engel introduced Habib Shamskhou, Stantec's Program Manager, and Corinne Dutra-Roberts, the 511 Contra Costa Program Manager; described the details of the transfer of the 511 Contra Costa Program to the CCTA and to Stantec, and advised that they would visit with staff of each jurisdiction to identify the needs and learn how to work best with each city in East County to move the program forward. He added there had been ongoing programs in each subregion consistent with the Countywide Transportation Plan's Actions Plans, and all those programs were continuing.

Corinne Dutra-Roberts, Stantec, Program Manager for the 511 Contra Costa Program for TRANSPLAN and TRANSPAC, highlighted the status of TDM programs including the Countywide Commuter Incentive Program, which was on target with previous years even though the incentive value had been reduced by 50 percent. She noted that any savings in that program would be applied to new programs.

Other programs highlighted were the Buy-One, Get-One Free Transit Pass, on par with participation last year; Discover & Go, encouraging bus-to-BART with use of the Cllipper® Card; SchoolPool, offering up to three bus passes per household; Summer Bike Challenge, which had been expanded to Martinez and Brentwood and which would hopefully expand next year to Oakley; and the Safe Transportation for Children programs including the Street Smarts program, and Education and Encouragement Assemblies for K-5 Bike/Ped, Middle School Bike Safety Assemblies, and the High School Program.

Mr. Engel explained that they were working on a Strategic Plan for each subregion, with two Technical Advisory Commission (TAC) members from East County and Central County to develop a plan to ultimately be presented to the TRANSPLAN and TRANSPAC Board of Directors.

Habib Shamskhou, Stantec Program Manager, explained that Stantec was assisting the CCTA to run the 511 Contra Costa Program and it was Stantec's hope to provide a new program and produce a 400 percent improvement to existing programs within the existing budget; all focused on demand management needs with a goal to move people from single occupancy to shared mobility to reduce congestion around schools, especially with drop-off and pick-up hours. He stated the new programs would deal with transportation network companies (TNCs) such as Uber, Lyft, and others and deal with shared use mobility programs and new transportation apps. In collaboration with the private sector, the intent was to address first/last mile transit access with the TNCs to maximize the underutilized capacity in cars with ridesharing choices, improve "transit accessibility," and fold everything into the existing Carpool Incentive Program and provide reliable trip data.

Mr. Shamskhou commented that they were also looking into shared use mobility by providing pods of neighborhood electric vehicles in proximity with the central business districts, car share pods to provide midday access to and from BART where transit had been underserved, and with the potential for autonomous vehicles hoped to reduce the need for two plus vehicles per household to be in compliance with checklist categories.

Bob Taylor suggested that many of the programs would not be utilized in East County, and as such accomplishing the proposals would not be possible.

Kevin Romick agreed and with respect to the first/last mile initiative, noted that Tri Delta Transit was currently the only transit system until eBART was operational, and the TNCs were not common in the area. While he appreciated the material, he suggested it was farfetched.

Mr. Shamskhou noted that while the TNCs were not readily available, there would have to be an incentive for people to use and encourage TNCs. He suggested a \$2 ride from Brentwood to the nearest BART station should work given that 73 percent of residents didn't have access to transit. In Brentwood, for instance, parents dropped their children off at school in single-driver automobiles, and he suggested the TNCs could help address that situation. He emphasized the desire to pursue a very progressive approach for all of East County to make a quantum leap in performance to move people from single-occupancy cars to other modes of transportation. He expressed a desire to make that happen with existing funding and would pursue new funding as well.

Mr. Engel explained that with new technology there was the ability to track the use and could incentivize users, and also incentivize drivers.

Mr. Shamskhou explained that they would return in about three months as part of the Strategic Plan and update the TRANSPLAN Committee on the programs. He emphasized that technology was needed to address the problems and that collaboration with the private sector was the key to be able to provide the necessary services.

BRUCE OHLSON, Bike East Bay, referred to the reference to 73 percent of East County citizens who did not have access to transit and had to drive to a bus stop, and asked how many of those residents would walk or bike to transit.

Mr. Shamskhou explained that 10 blocks was the typical distance someone would walk to transit.

At its December 14, 2016 meeting, the Authority discussed the following items, which may be of interest to the Regional Transportation Planning Committees:

- Randell H. Iwasaki, **Executive Director**
- 1. Accepted Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and Management Letter for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2016. Staff sought acceptance of the Fiscal Audit and Management Letter for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2016. The purpose of the CAFR is to provide an independent assessment and audit of the Authority's financial statements to accurately portray financial activities that occurred during the fiscal year. The auditors, Macias, Gini, & O'Connell LLP (MGO) provided a brief overview of the statements. The Authority Board accepted the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report and Management Letter for Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2016. The CAFR is located on the Authority's website at www.ccta.net.
- 2. Updated Work Plan for Completion of the Countywide Transportation Plan (CTP) during Calendar Year 2017. During 2017, the Authority's Planning Section will re-issue the Draft CTP and Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for public review and comment. Final adoption of the CTP is expected by end of year. Staff recommended that the Authority review and approve the proposed Work Plan and schedule of activities. The Authority Board reviewed and approved the proposed Updated Work Plan and schedule of activities for completion of the Countywide Transportation Plan during Calendar Year 2017.

- 3. Update on MTC's Plan Bay Area 2040 Preferred Scenario. MTC and ABAG have approved the Final Preferred Scenario and Investment Strategy for inclusion in the environmental analysis of the Plan Bay Area 2040 (a.k.a. the 2017 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)). The Preferred Scenario proposes a pattern of household and employment growth that will stem the growth of in-commuters from outlying counties, and begin to address the Bay Area's housing shortage. In parallel with the demographic forecasts, the 2017 RTP includes a financially-constrained suite of \$303 billion in transportation investments for the Bay Area through 2040, and reflects the revenue outcomes of the November elections. The Authority received staff's report.
- 4. Update on Coordinated Call for Projects. In September 2016, the Authority released a Coordinated Call for Projects for the second cycle of the One Bay Area Grant (OBAG 2) and Measure J Transportation for Livable Communities (TLC) and Pedestrian, Bicycle and Trail Facilities (PBTF) programs. Applications were due by December 9, 2016. Staff updated the Authority on the status of the process for reviewing applications received and bringing a coordinated funding program for final approval by the Authority in June 2017. The Authority received staff's report.

- State Route 4 Widening State Route 4 Bypass
- State Route 239eBART

Monthly Status Report: December 2016

Information updated from previous report is in *underlined italics*.

STATE ROUTE 4 WIDENING

A. SR4 Widening: Railroad Avenue to Loveridge Road COMPLETED

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: The project widened the existing highway from two to four lanes in each direction (including HOV lanes) from approximately one mile west of Railroad Avenue to approximately ³/₄ mile west of Loveridge Road and provided a median for future transit.

Current Project Phase: Completed.

Project Status: Landscaping of the freeway mainline started in December 2009 and was completed in June 2010. A three-year plant establishment and maintenance period is currently in progress as required by the Cooperative Agreement with Caltrans, was complete on June 24, 2013. Caltrans has accepted the project and will take over the maintenance responsibilities. The CCTA Board accepted the completed construction contract, approved the final contractor progress payment, approved the release of the retention funds to the contractor, and authorized staff to close construction Contract No. 241 at its September 18, 2013 meeting.

Issues/Areas of Concern: None.

B. SR4 Widening: Loveridge Road to Somersville Road COMPLETED

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: The project will widen State Route 4 (e) from two to four lanes in each direction (including HOV Lanes) between Loveridge Road and Somersville Road. The project provides a median for future mass transit. The environmental document also addresses future widening to SR 160.

Current Project Phase: Completed.

Project Status: Caltrans accepted the contract on June 30, 2014. The construction contract is now closed with no outstanding claims.

Issues/Areas of Concern: None.

C. SR4 Widening: Somersville Road to SR 160

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: This project will widen State Route 4 (e) from two to four lanes in each direction (including HOV Lanes) from Somersville Road to Hillcrest Avenue and then six lanes to SR 160, including a wide median for transit. The project also includes the reconstruction of the Somersville Road Interchange, Contra Loma/L Street Interchange, G Street Overcrossing, Lone Tree Way/A Street Interchange, Cavallo Undercrossing and the Hillcrest Avenue Interchange.

Current Project Phase: Construction.

Project Status: The project is divided into four segments: 1) Somersville Interchange; 2) Contra Loma Interchange and G Street Overcrossing; 3A) A Street Interchange and Cavallo Undercrossing and 3B) Hillcrest Avenue to Route 160.

Segment 1: Somersville Interchange

Segment was open to traffic in December 2013.

Segment 2: Contra Loma Blvd. to A St./Lone Tree Way

Construction began in March 2012 and was completed in February 2016.

Segment 3A: A Street Interchange and Cavallo Undercrossing

Construction began in August 2012 and is anticipated to be complete in summer 2016.

Segment 3B: Hillcrest Avenue to SR160

Construction began in March 2013 and is anticipated to be complete in summer 2016.

Issues/Areas of Concern:

• Due to the drought emergency, the Landscaping project is being re-designed to utilize reclaimed water where possible. Reclaimed water is also being used for dust control and compaction.

D. SR4 Bypass: SR4/SR160 Connector Ramps COMPLETED

Project Fund Source: Bridge Toll Funds

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: Complete the two missing movements between SR4 Bypass and State Route 160, specifically the westbound SR4 Bypass to northbound SR160 ramp and the southbound SR160 to eastbound SR4 Bypass ramp.

Current Phase: Completed.

Project Status:

- The project opened to traffic on February 29, 2016.
- Final paving is complete and a ribbon cutting was held on February 29, 2016.

Issues/Areas of Concern: None.

E. East County Rail Extension (eBART)

CCTA Fund Source: Measure C and J

Lead Agency: BART/CCTA

eBART Construction Contact: Mark Dana: mdana@bart.gov

Project Description: Implement rail transit improvements in the State Route 4 corridor from the Pittsburg Bay Point station in the west to a station in Antioch in the vicinity of Hillcrest in the east.

Current Project Phase: Construction.

Project Status:

- The project is in the construction phase and is being completed under multiple contracts managed by BART.
- The overall construction of the transfer platform (Contract 110) in the median is complete.
- The Hillcrest parking lot, maintenance shop building (shell) and improvements to Slatten Ranch Road (Contract 120) are complete.
- Contract 130, consisting of stations and maintenance facility finishes, track work and systems is underway.

Issues/Areas of Concern: None.

F. SR4 Operational Improvements: I-680 to Bailey Road (6006)

CCTA Fund Source: Measure J

Lead Agency: City of Concord

Project Description: The project will evaluate various operational improvements along SR4 between I-680 and Bailey Road, including the addition of mixed flow lanes, high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes and auxiliary lanes.

Current Project Phase: Preliminary Studies/Planning

Project Status: Draft Project Study Report – Project Development Support (PSR-PDS) was to identify project improvements and an implementation phasing plan is in circulation through Caltrans.

Issues/Areas of Concern: Project has significant funding shortfall. However, \$108 million in funding is included in proposed Measure X.

STATE ROUTE 4 BYPASS PROJECT

G. SR4 Bypass: Widen to 4 Lanes – Laurel Rd to Sand Creek Rd & Sand Creek Rd I/C – Phase 1
COMPLETED

CCTA Fund Source: Measure J

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: Widen the State Route 4 Bypass from 2 to 4 lanes (2 in each direction) from Laurel Road to Sand Creek Road, and construct the Sand Creek Interchange. The interchange will have diamond ramps in all quadrants with the exception of the southwest quadrant.

Current Phase: Completed.

Project Status: Construction completed 2015.

Issues/Areas of Concern: None.

H. SR4 Bypass: Balfour Road Interchange – Phase 1 (5005)

CCTA Fund Source: East Contra Costa Regional Fee and Finance Authority (ECCRFFA)

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: The Phase 1 project will include a new SR4 bridge crossing over Balfour Road, providing one southbound and one northbound lane for SR4; northbound and southbound SR4 loop onramps, servicing both westbound and eastbound Balfour Road traffic; and northbound and southbound SR4 diagonal off-ramps.

Current Phase: Right of Way and Utilities.

Project Status:

- The final design is completed.
- Right of Way acquisition by the SR 4 Bypass Authority is nearing completion with the Kinder Morgan MOU executed.
- Utility Encasement Exception Request had been submitted to Caltrans for approval.
- The PG&E transmission towers have been relocated.

• Advance joint trench relocation work by AT&T, Comcast and PG&E is ongoing.

Issues/Areas of Concern:

- The utility relocation schedule provides limited schedule contingency. The construction bid will include workarounds to minimize delay risk.
- Complications associated with the Kinder Morgan relocation agreement have delayed finalizing the right-of-way agreements and certification.

I. SR4 Bypass: Mokelumne Trail Bike/Pedestrian Overcrossing (portion of Project 5002)

CCTA Fund Source: Measure J

Lead Agency: CCTA

Project Description: Construct a pedestrian and bicycle overcrossing near the Mokelumne Trail at SR4. The overcrossing will include a multi-span bridge with columns in the SR4 median. Bridge approaches will be constructed on earthen embankments. The path width is assumed to be 12 feet wide. This project is required as a condition of approval under the SR-4 Bypass project.

Current Phase: Design.

Project Status:

- The CEQA clearance is complete.
- The 65% design plans are complete.
- The current focus is to obtain approval of Caltrans Permit Engineering Evaluation Report (PEER).

Issues/Areas of Concern:

- Right of Way and construction funding for the project has not been identified yet.
- Project costs may escalate as schedule is impacted by funding shortfall.
- The NEPA clearance, if needed, may be problematic.
- BART announced that the recommended new station location for a future eBART extension should be at a location adjacent to the point of contact. The impacts of this decision will need to be considered.

STATE ROUTE 239 (BRENTWOOD-TRACY EXPRESSWAY) PHASE 1 - PLANNING

November 2016 Update – No Changes from Last Month

Study Status: Current project activities include model development, compilation of mapping data/conceptual alignments, development of staff and policy advisory groups, Project Visioning/Strategy-Scenario Development, and preparation of the Draft Feasibility Study.

Administration: Responsibility for the State Route 239 Study the associated federal funding was transferred from Contra Costa County to the Contra Costa Transportation Authority in January 2012.

The Next Segment Study is a pre-feasibility evaluation of the Bypass and Mococo alignments beyond Hillcrest Avenue, and review of six possible future station site opportunities. Station sites being evaluated on the Bypass alignment are: Laurel Road, Lone Tree Way, Mokelumne Trail crossing of SR4, Sand Creek Road, Balfour, and a location near Marsh Creek Road and the Bypass serving Byron and Discovery Bay. The Next Segment Study will be completed in early 2013.

Recommendation

APPOINT a TRANSPLAN Committee member to the odd year primary representative seat for the Contra Costa Transportation Authority ("CCTA") Board for the 2/1/2017 through 1/31/2019 term.

APPOINT a TRANSPLAN Committee member as the odd year alternate for the CCTA Board for the 2/1/2017 through 1/31/2019 term.

Background

The CCTA Board is comprised of eleven (11) elected officials ("Commissioners") who have been appointed for two year terms by the Regional Transportation Planning Committees ("RTPCs") (two appointed members each from SWAT, TRANSPAC, TRANSPLAN, and WCCTAC), the Conference of Mayors (one appointed member), and the County Board of Supervisors (two appointed members).

The CCTA Board is empowered to administer the Expenditure Plan, the Growth Management and Congestion Management Programs, and to determine the use of sales tax revenue in conformance with the parameters established in Measure J. CCTA also serves as Contra Costa's Congestion Management Agency, and as such, has final approval of the County's Congestion Management Plan ("CMP") and the Countywide Transportation Plan ("CTP").

Commissioner Kevin Romick's term on the CCTA Board will be expiring on 1/31/2017. CCTA has requested that TRANSPLAN make an appointment to the CCTA Board for the two-year period from 2/1/2017 through 1/31/2019. The alternate, Commissioner Sal Evola, must also be reappointed or replaced. The history of TRANSPLAN appointments to the CCTA Board is attached.

The Committee should be aware of provisions in the CCTA Administrative Code regarding the appointment of Commissioners to the CCTA Board (relevant excerpts below):

- "The Board shall consist of the following: (2) Two members from TRANSPLAN, each of whom is an Elected Official." (CCTA Admin. Code Ch. 1, Art. III, 103.2)
- "Each participating Commissioner shall also have a designated alternate and may have a designated second alternate..." (CCTA Admin. Code Ch. 1, Art. III, 103.2(b))

- "An Elected Official may be designated by more than one Commissioner as an alternate, provided that such Elected Official shall not simultaneously serve on behalf of more than one Commissioner." (CCTA Admin. Code Ch. 1, Art. III, 103.2(b))
- "For election or recall of Commissioners, only City and County Elected Officials shall vote, and each City and Board of Supervisors shall have one vote for each such action." (CCTA Admin. Code Ch. 1, Art. IV, 104.3(b))
